- > Parents will be offered opportunities for learning how to foster improved academic performance for their child (ren). The district will have meaningful involvement with parents and will design evidence-based strategies for more effective parental involvement.
- Parent representatives (including parents of Title I, Part A students) will be involved in decision making by the development, review and evaluation of the campus/district improvement plans.
- The district will provide professional development to staff members about the value of working with families as partners with the goal of improving student achievement to build capacity of all schools within the district.
- ➤ Title I, Part A parents will be involved annually in the review/revision of the School/Parent Compact and will coordinate and integrate parent and family engagement strategies with other relevant Federal, State and local programs.
- ➤ Title I, Part A parents will be asked to complete surveys seeking evaluation of the Title I, Part A program and parent engagement.
- Parents will annually review/revise this policy.

All students at West Rusk CCISD are considered Title I students. West Rusk CCISD qualifies as a Title I school wide campus because at least 40% of the students are considered economically disadvantaged. This allows the district to use the federal Title I. Part A funds for all students.
